Safety Reminder

As we reopen more areas, we want to reinforce the importance of properly wearing a mask/face covering, washing your hands and utilizing hand sanitizing stations throughout the building, and staying six feet or more away from others. I appreciate your help in keeping everyone safe!

Fitness Center

Beginning Monday, September 14, the Fitness Center will re-open for resident use Monday-Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The capacity is four residents at one time. If the Fitness Center is full when you arrive, a staff member will ask you to wait in the hall until space becomes available. Any resident wishing to schedule a supervised session with the staff should contact Bill Burtner at ext. 8543. The following guidelines will remain in place:

- All Fitness Center users will have a temperature check before entry
- Masks/face coverings are required
- Sanitize your hands before and after using the Fitness Center (hand sanitizing stations are located immediately to your left when entering the room as well as across the hall next to the elevator)
- DO NOT use the Fitness Center if you are sick or aren't feeling well
- Fitness Center is available for Independent Living and Personal Care residents only (NO GUESTS, FAMILY MEMBERS or EMPLOYEES at this time)
